These British imports, will appeal to students who like wacky humor.






Stinkbomb and his messy little sister Ketchup-Face get themselves into madcap adventures in this fun series of 3rd grade books.

Mac Barnett tells his childhood story—as a spy for the Queen of England. It's a spoof, of course, but






there are real themes here, too. This series would be a great fit for advanced but reluctant readers.
